



Hernia

Hernias are a common condition that occurs when an internal organ or tissue bulges through a weak spot in the abdominal wall. There is no medical treatment for a hernia. Therefore, it must be repaired surgically in order to prevent complications. One option for hernia surgery is to use the da Vinci Surgical System, a robotic technology which allows a surgeon to perform minimally invasive surgery with the greatest precision.

The Procedure

During robotic hernia surgery, the surgeon makes a few small incisions in the patient's abdomen. The da Vinci system's instruments are then inserted through the incisions, along with a tiny camera. The robotic arms are attached to the instruments. The surgeon then works at the console beside the patient to control the instruments and camera, allowing for precise and controlled movements in order to repair the hernia defect. This type of surgery results in less scarring and pain, therefore less need for pain medication. This leads to a faster recovery time than traditional open surgery.



What to Expect Before Surgery

Consultation with the surgeon to see if you are a candidate for robotic hernia surgery. Your surgeon will discuss the procedure and address any concerns or questions you may have.

Preoperative testing, including blood work and imaging tests may be necessary.

Fasting for a period of time before the surgery.

Avoiding certain medications, including blood thinners, in the days leading up to the surgery.

What to Expect After Surgery

Majority of hernia surgery patients are discharged home the day of surgery. More complex cases may need to stay overnight in the hospital.

Approximately 1/3 of patients have their pain controlled with medication such as Tylenol or Motrin. Other patients may need a small amount of stronger pain pills in the immediate postoperative period.

Limited physical activity for a period of time after the surgery.

Follow-up appointments with the surgeon to monitor recovery and healing.
